In classes, there has been much excitement already with the introduction of new big questions and and we have had the Museum Service in to whet the children's appetites for their new projects too. Celebration Assemblies have started again and we welcome families to join us on a Friday at 8:55am.

Willow Class

In Willow Class we have settled into school life playing games to encourage turn taking and listening and practising numbers and letters. We have shared stories like Pete the Cat and his New Shoes, Pete the Cat and his 4 Groovy Buttons, The Colour Monster and A Pocketful of Kisses! And Emily Brown And The Thing. We have drawn Self Portraits and tried writing our names and drawn people who are special to us. We have tried school snack, practised for the fire alarm and got changed for PE. We have played with blocks,

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dressed up and sang and played with our buddies. Last week we enjoyed sharing our Starting School books with Teachers and friends. This week we welcomed visitors from Horsham Museum and investigated some very old toys, talking about how they are different from toys today. We have experimented with mixing colours and made some very large models with blocks, dressed up and been singing.

Beech Class

It has been my pleasure to welcome back Beech Class this new year. We have been very busy; we have had a visit from the Horsham museam, we have designed our own toys and written about them and even learnt about primary and secondary colours. We have had a fab 2 weeks!

We have started a new book called 'Max And The Millions' by Ross Montgomery. The book is all about a boy who discovers a secret world of tiny people. We have loved it so far. In vipers, we look at different aspects of reading and this week we were retrieving information from the book about the headmaster. This is what we think he would look like. 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We have explored place value this week. The year 1's have used dienes, counters and tens frames and the year 2's have been counting forward and back within 50, it will be 100 next! In history, we have looked at toys throught time and looking at what they are made from. Lots of the older toys are made from wood because plastic was not invented then!



In computing, we learnt about the importance of naming and dating our work. We had the choice of drawing a self portrait on an ipad, computer or on



paper.

Holly Class

Holly we have started with our key question "What tools do we need to survive?". We've been looking at the Stone Age and have considered what precious items Stone Age people may have saved in a crisis. We used drama to imagine ourselves as Stone Age villagers, we made characters and a village map, which we will be using to help our writing.



In English, we've written descriptions of our village using noun phrases and adjectives. In maths, we have been working on place value – exploring hundreds and thousands using dienes. We have looked at number lines and ordering 3 and 4 digit numbers.



In History, we considered how Stone Age people would find food by foraging. We had images of lots of berries, mushrooms and plants around the room and we had to sort them into "safe" and "unsafe" piles. We were then joined by a mushroom expert from Silver Birch Tristram who revealed to us how successful we were with our guesses. He told us that often things that are red are poisonous and unfortunately we had selected some red berries and mushrooms to eat! We loved our visit from Horsham museum. We learned

what it meant to be an



archaeologist. We practised carefully removing artefacts from sand, we attempted to measure and repiece pottery back together and categorised different tools.

We have also created a big collage of Stonehenge which is one display in the classroom. In PE and drama we have been focusing on listening, communication and teamwork skills.

Silver Birch Class

We have had a fantastic start to the autumn term, already extremely busy! To kick off our theme of the Ancient Egyptians and our characteristics of Values, we learned how to write our name and a secret message using Hieroglyphics. To help us remember some of the many symbols, we completed some circuit training tasks!



In English, we have started with a film unit based on time travelling back to Ancient Egypt. We have become time travellers and are just writing about what we are experiencing as we come out of our portal. We have started to read Secrets of a Sun King in our VIPERS sessions and will be using this for our English lessons in a few weeks. We have focused on presentation of work and asking ourselves the question, 'Is this the best I can do?'

In science, we became Embalmers where we used natron to start the mummification process with tomatoes and apples! Ask your child what the natron is expected to do. We are starting to learn about the Circulatory System and we will be making blood smoothies to learn about the different components next week.



In P.E, we have focused on fitness and exercise as this links nicely to science and the Circulatory system. We also started to learn about Hockey and took part in some taster tasks.

We were lucky to have Horsham Museum visit and hook us into the theme of the Ancient Egyptians. We now know so much more but the session has inspired us to research even further so we are looking forward to our history sessions.



In maths, Year 5's have revisited Roman Numerals and we will be learning about numbers up to 10000. The Year 6's have started their place value unit and looking at numbers to a million. Please continue to practice times tables when you can.
