Helping children grow into confident, thoughtful and responsible individuals is most effective when families and schools work together in a spirit of mutual trust and support.

At our school, we greatly value the partnership between home and school. By working closely together, sharing successes and addressing challenges collaboratively, we can provide the best possible support for every child.

Our Home-School Agreement reflects this shared commitment. It recognises the important contribution parents and carers make to their child's education and highlights the positive relationship we aim to build between families, staff and the wider school community.

As a parent/carer I will:

Accept the school's aims and Christian values and, having chosen this school for my child, positively support the school and its policies for behaviour and learning.

Let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect my child's learning or behaviour.

Make sure my child attends school each day, ready to start learning at 8:45am and is collected on time at the end of the day or after a club.

Treat school staff with respect, refraining from physical and verbal abuse and set a good example when on school premises.

Send my child to school in the correct, named school uniform, along with a water bottle and any other resources that are requested.

Support and encourage the completion of home learning by my child within the allocated time.

Attend parents' evenings and discussions about my child's progress and, when possible, attend information evenings and workshops provided by the school.

Check MCAS and the website to keep up to date with important information.

Aim for my child's attendance to be 100% and aim to avoid term time holidays but to notify the school by 9.00am if my child is ever absent.

Keep school informed of my up-to-date contact details in case of an emergency.

As a school we will:

Follow our whole child vision and use our Christian values of Love, Respect, Resilience, and Honesty to guide us.

Provide a broad and balanced curriculum and meet the individual educational needs of every child.

Care for each child's safety, wellbeing and happiness.

Support children in developing excellent learning behaviours, promoting high standards of work and behaviour.

Strive to build positive working relationships and to welcome parents and carers into school and value their involvement in school life.

Respond to any questions or concerns parents and carers may have as quickly as possible and contact parents and carers if there are any concerns with a child's well-being, learning, behaviour, attendance or punctuality.

Keep parents and carers informed about the school and school activities through regular letters and emails home, end of year reports and by updating the school website.

Provide information, workshops and consultations that will give parents and carers confidence to support their child in their learning.

Set and monitor home learning in accordance with the school's Home Learning Policy.

Allow children safe and secure use of the Internet by fostering a responsible attitude in all pupils, in partnership with parents and carers.

As a pupil I will:

Be an active learner by asking questions, showing enthusiasm and contributing to lessons, taking responsibility to be the best that I can be.

Attend school on time, in uniform, with all the things I need, including a full PE kit and water bottle.

Respect my right and the right of others to an education and do all my class work and home learning to the best of my ability.

Listen to every adult in school and follow their instructions.

Follow the 3 Be's school rules: Be Ready, Be Safe, Be Respectful and demonstrate the school values of love, respect, resilience and honesty.

Tell an adult if I am worried or unhappy.

Ask for help if I need it and try my best in all that I do.

Ensure I complete my home learning.

Use the Internet responsibly and tell an adult if I am worried about anything I have seen.
