Sport has always been important at Bolney CEP both within the curriculum and as part of the extra-curricular experiences. In addition to many of the children being involved in competitions and sports events against other schools in the summer term, we also hosted our annual sports day where families were able to come and cheer on the children in a variety of sporting events. It is always a fun afternoon for all involved and a celebration of the new skills that are learnt over the summer term in Athletics lessons.



The cricket club kindly allowed the school to use their pavilion as the backdrop for the Year 5 and 6 summer production which was a huge success. Having read the book 'Holes' by Louis Sachar, the class then performed a stage version to the whole school and families. The story lent itself to being performed outside and the glorious weather also fitted the bill perfectly. The whole class loved the experience and I am sure will have lasting memories of performing.



Funding for schools is always tight, so we are very lucky to have an incredibly proactive PTA group, the Friends of Bolney, who, over the course of each year, host events to raise money which goes directly to enrich the children's educational experience. At the end of the summer term, they organised and ran the Bolney Summer Blast at the Cider Tap and it felt very much like a village fete with so many families and community members attending. As with all events, we welcome the local community's involvement and are always looking for experts to come and work with or talk to the children about their passions.
